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1. BRIEF PROFESSIONAL SUMMARY

Eiji Yamada is a Professor of English Linguistics at the Department of English at Fukuoka University, Japan. His publications are on English and Japanese linguistics, with a focus on phonology. He has published extensively on compound words in English, Japanese pitch accent, and English word stress.

In 1988-1989, he was a Visiting Scholar at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, USA. From 2001-2003 he was president of the Fukuoka Linguistic Circle. From 2003 to 2007 he was a board member (co-director) of the Phonological Society of Japan, and in 2011-2012 he was Editor-in-Chief of *Phonological Studies*, the journal of the Phonological Society of Japan.

From 2012-2021, Professor Yamada was a councilor of the English Linguistic Society of Japan. From 2012-2015 he was a member of the editorial committee of the journal *Studies in English Literature* at the English Literary Society of Japan, and from 2013 to the present he has been a member of the editorial committee of the journal *Kyushu Studies in English Literature* at the English Literary Society of Japan, Kyushu Branch.

From 2017-2019, Professor Yamada was president of the English Literary Society of Japan, Kyushu Branch, and a board member (co-director) of the English Literary Society of Japan. From 2017-2019 he was vice-president of the Phonological Society of Japan.
